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The 1917 Constitution: The Foundation of Mexican Democracy

The Mexican forces defeated the French invasion at the First Battle of Puebla on May 5, 1862 (hence the official Mexican celebration of Cinco de Mayo, or the Fifth of May). While Mexico was in the end successful in fighting off foreign invasion, it was far from being a stable country. The man who led the resistance against the French invasion, Mexican President Benito Juárez, did not live long to govern an independent Mexico. Five years after liberating Mexico, Juárez had died in 1872. Porfirio Díaz, a protégé and also rival of Juárez, took control of Mexi-

co in a coup where he would rule Mexico until 1911. He greatly improved the country's infrastructure, and had helped build up Mexico's cities that had been ravaged by almost 40 years of war and political instability.

But during this time there were no free and fair elections, and Díaz simply put in his cronies in all parts of government. The Mexican peasant was little better off in 1910 than when Mexico successfully fought off the French in 1867. The average Mexican had no legal rights, and for the most part did not hold title to the land they had lived on for centuries. Certainly the average

Mexican had no voice in their own government, and Díaz made sure that he remained in power for over a generation. Although he was now nearing his eighties, he had no intention of giving up power. Díaz held complete and total power. During the presidential election of 1910, Díaz had rigged the election to make sure that he remained in power.

The Mexican people, however, no longer could tolerate Díaz's dictatorship, and despite his attempt in staying in power a reformer named Francisco Madero led a widespread revolt that forced Díaz to resign in 1911. Díaz fled the country, and all

of the pent up forces that had been simmering for decades now exploded in what would become the Mexican Revolution (1910 to 1920). This revolution would lead into a downward spiral of civil war, warlord armies vying for power, and numerous peasant revolts. Yet out of all this chaos came a very important document that would forever change the history of Mexico. In 1917, the Constituent Congress worked on a document in Santiago de Queretaro in Queretaro state to give the Mexican people a form of stable government.

This new document proposed that a candidate for the presidency could only hold a single six year term

as president. Afterwards, that person could never hold another term as president. The constitution proposed a Senate and a Chamber of Deputies, and that any and all political parties could nominate a candidate to be in either house or for election to the presidency. But this constitution went further. It called for what defined a Mexican citizen, land reform where the average Mexican had rights to their land, and basic legal rights that were inviolable. The whole point of this constitution was to set up a government where the government protected the rights of Mexican citizens, and limited the power of the government in what it could do. This constitution was meant to prevent another dictatorship from arising, and

give the people a voice in their own government. The 1917 Constitution was important in that it helped Mexico eventually become a more stable country and by 1920 bring an end to the chaos of the revolution.

Since then, Mexico has become one of the most stable countries in the Americas. Since the 1917 Constitution was put into place, Mexico has never experienced military coups, civil war, or a complete political breakdown as happened in the Mexican Revolution. About the only other successfully stable country in Latin America is Costa Rica, which abolished its military in 1948. Because of the 1917 Constitution, Mexico has played a significant role in the stability of the Americas.

All in the Name for Cotton

The Second French Empire's design to conquer Mexico in 1862 was not just about imperial expansion. It had as much to do about economics as well. Before the U.S. Civil War (1861 to 1865), the southern states were one of the major producers of raw cotton in the world. The factory mills in both Great Britain and France received large quantities of southern American cotton and used

it to manufacture clothes and other materials for their people as well as for export to their colonies. Because of this, American southern raw cotton was vital to their industries. American ships took raw cotton weekly to British and French sea ports from where the cotton was off-loaded by carriage and immediately processed in the factories. This had been the pattern between the United States and Great Britain and France for decades.

This all changed when 11 southern states seceded from the rest of the United States and proclaimed themselves a new nation known as the Confederate States of America. The Confederacy did not have much in the way of products that it could use for making money on the international market. It did however have cotton, and cotton was very much in demand in Europe and especially in Britain and France. U.S. President Abraham Lincoln,

who wanted to retake the 11 southern states that had seceded, was not going to allow the Confederacy to trade with any part of the world. He had put in an effective blockade of all Confederate ports, stopping all trade between the Confederacy and the world. The Confederate states tried any means to get their cotton out for export.

Despite Confederacy's best efforts, the United States largely prevented this trade from being successful. As a result, raw cotton went up over twice its value and thus created a crisis for Europe in being unable to get the raw cotton it needed. Great Britain largely solved this problem by importing cotton from Egypt. France had a real dilemma; where to get the cotton to help keep their empire going? This was one of the decisions in why the Second French Empire chose to take over Mexico in 1862. France not only wanted Mexico's silver and gold as well as rich farmland, but with Mexico in their hands the French could more easily obtain raw cotton from the Confederacy because south-



ern cotton was readily traded through the Mexican town of Matamoros. For French Emperor Napoleon III, the seizure of Mexico was a sound strategy especially when the United States was too busy fighting the Confederacy.

When the U.S. Civil War ended, the U.S. government took a dim view of the French holding on to Mexico. The Mexican forces under then Mexican President Benito Juarez, was beginning to receive massive U.S. aid to

fight the French. Seeing that their hold on Mexico was in jeopardy, and fearing a rise of the military might of Prussia, Emperor Napoleon III withdrew French forces from Mexico in 1866. In the end, the French conquest of Mexico was not worth it for the French because shipments of southern cotton resumed and France no longer had a cotton problem. It is a supreme irony that one of the reasons for the French invasion of Mexico was for cotton.

National Museum of Mexican Art Acquires Fire Station, Enhancing Youth Programs

The National Museum of Mexican Art (NMMA), one of the country's prominent Latino cultural organizations, recently acquired a decommissioned fire station, 2358 S. Whipple St. in Little Village, from the City of Chicago in an effort to provide ample services to youth.

"We are incredibly grateful to Mayor Brandon Johnson, to Chicago's Department of Planning and Development and Alderman Byron Sigcho-Lopez for shepherding the project through the City Council, to Alderman Michael Rodriguez for his support, and to Commissioner George Cardenas, Cook County Board of Review Commissioner of the First District and former alderman, who initiated the project. Yollocalli is an important part of the Museum's mission and legacy," said Founder and President Emeritus of NMMA Carlos Tortolero. In October, the City Council approved the \$1 sale of the City-owned property to the Museum for redevelopment into a community center for arts programming. Once refurbished, the 8,600-square-foot building will be home to a second location for Yollocalli Arts Reach, an award-winning youth initiative of the Museum that offers free arts and culture programming to teens and young adults.

"We are beyond excited at the opportunity to repurpose this vacant building and expand our youth arts programming, providing critical resources to youth in Little Village and surrounding neighborhoods," said Yanet Garcia, Museum Trustee, Co-Chair of the Fire station Committee, and Vice

President, Construction at Related Midwest. "We look forward to working with our partners to make this important initiative a reality."

According to NMMA, the Yollocalli program



has outgrown its current programming space within the Little Village Boys & Girls Club. Museum leaders believe the additional facility will allow Yollocalli programming to double its capacity, serving 300 more students through after-school and summer programs. The total development cost of the project is estimated at \$4 million, which the Museum expects to finance through grants and related funding, pro-bono and discounted services, and support from Museum advocates. "We're thrilled to expand our programming for the youth of Little Village and the Chicagoland area," said Vanessa Sanchez, Director of Education and Yollocalli Arts Reach. "We see the fire station as a spark for youth joy and expression, creative opportunities, partnerships, and community. As a former student of Yollocalli, I look forward to continuing its legacy in this place, and just like its name, it will be the 'house of the heart' for more young people."



According to NMMA, the main floor of the building will include a reception area, staff offices, lounge areas, a gallery, and a recording booth. Yollocalli students will utilize the first floor, which will also be open to community members for meetings, workshops, performances,

and other gatherings. The second floor will include four art studios, additional breakout rooms, and gathering spaces. Work to renovate and restore the building is underway. The Museum hopes to open the new facility in early 2025.
