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Yollocalli Arts Center Groundbreaking Ceremony Marks New Era

A pool of community leaders, including Mayor Brandon Johnson, Congressman Jesús "Chuy" García, Commissioner George Cardenas, and NMMA President Emeritus Carlos Tortolero, to name a few joined together for the groundbreaking ceremony for the Yollocalli Arts Reach Center on Friday, June 21st in Little Village.

"We celebrate the expansion of the National Museum of Mexican Arts flagship youth program, ensuring more opportunities and resources for young people. There is a great work being done by Yollocalli, and we are thrilled to support them in their support of our communities," said Mayor Johnson.

The National Museum of Mexican Art acquired the decommissioned fire station, 2358 S. Whipple, in Little Village in April 2024. Once restored, the 8,600-square-foot building will be home to a second location for Yollocalli Arts Reach, the award-winning youth initiative of the Museum that offers free arts and culture programming to teens and young adults. The renovated site will also provide a much-needed community gathering space for multigenerational activities. With the second facility NMMA will double the number of students Yollocalli serves.

"This is not just a

building; it will be a community space and creative hub for young people from all over Southwest Chicago," said Congressman García. "The new center will allow Yollocalli to double the number of youth it currently serves. It will be a nurturing environment where our youth can explore their talents and express themselves."

In October, the City Council approved the \$1 sale of the City-owned property to the Museum for redevelopment into a community center for arts programming. According to NMMA, the Yollocalli program has outgrown its current programming space within the Little Village Boys & Girls Club. Museum leaders believe the additional facility will allow Yollocalli programming to double its capacity, serving 300 more students through after-school and summer programs. "To the youth of Little Village, this center is for you. It is a testament to your potential and your boundless creativity. Here, you will find the tools, guidance, and support to explore new horizons, to heal, and to grow. Let this be a place where your voices are heard, your talents are nurtured, and your dreams are realized," said Commissioner Cardenas.

The total development cost



of the project is estimated at \$4 million, which the Museum expects to finance through grants and related funding, pro-bono and discounted services, and support from Museum advocates. Yollocalli Arts Reach, is an award-winning initiative of the National Museum of Mexican Art (NMMA). According to NMMA, the main floor of the building will include a reception area, staff offices, lounge areas, a gallery, and a recording booth. Yollocalli students will utilize the first floor, which will also be open to community members for meetings, workshops, performances, and other gatherings. The second floor will include four art studios, additional breakout rooms, and gathering spaces. Since its creation by NMMA in 1997, the Yollocalli Arts Reach initiative has provided equal access to communal, artistic, and cultural resources for youth. Work to renovate and restore the building is underway. The

Museum hopes to open the new facility in early 2025.

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La Ceremonia de Inauguración del Centro de Artes Yollocalli Marca Nueva Era

Un grupo de líderes comunitarios, incluyendo al Alcalde Brandon Johnson, al Congresista Jesús “Chuy” García, al Comisionado George Cárdenas y al Presidente Emérito de NMMA, Carlos Tortolero, por nombrar algunos, se unieron en la ceremonia de inauguración de Yollocalli Arts Reach Center, el viernes, 21 de junio, en La Villita. “Celebramos la ampliación del emblemático programa juvenil del Museo Nacional de Arte Mexicano, asegurando más oportunidades y recursos para los jóvenes. Yollocalli ha hecho una gran labor y estamos entusiasmados de respaldarlos en su apoyo a nuestras comunidades”, dijo el Alcalde Johnson.

El Museo Nacional de Arte Mexicano adquirió

la decomisada estación de bomberos en el 2358 S. Whipple en La Villita en abril del 2024. Una vez restaurado, el edificio de 8,600 pies cuadrados será sede de un segundo local de Yollocalli Arts Reach, premiada iniciativa juvenil del Museo, que ofrece la programación de arte y cultura gratis a adolescentes y adultos jóvenes. El renovado sitio ofrecerá también el tan necesitado espacio de reunión para actividades multi-generacionales. Con la segunda instalación, NMMA duplicará el número de estudiantes que Yollocalli atiende.

“Este no es solo un edificio; será un espacio comunitario y un centro creativo para los jóvenes de todo el sudoeste de Chicago”, dijo el Congresista García. El nuevo centro permitirá

a Yollocalli duplicar el número de jóvenes que actualmente atiende. Será un ambiente nutritivo donde nuestros jóvenes puedan explorar sus talentos y expresarse a sí mismos”.

En octubre, el Concilio de la Ciudad aprobó la venta de \$1 de la propiedad de la ciudad al Museo, para ser remodelado en un centro comunitario para programación de arte. De acuerdo a NMMA, el programa de Yollocalli ha superado su espacio de programación actual dentro del Club Boys & Girls de La Villita. Líderes del Museo creen que la instalación adicional permitirá a la programación de Yollocalli duplicar su capacidad, atendiendo a 300 más estudiantes en los programas de verano y después de la escuela. “A los jóvenes de La Villita,

este centro es para ustedes. Es un testamento a su potencial y creatividad sin límites. Aquí encontrarán las herramientas, la guía y el apoyo para explorar nuevos horizontes, para sanar y crecer. Que este sea un lugar donde se escuche su voz, se nutran sus talentos y se realicen sus sueños”, dijo el Comisionado Cárdenas.

El costo total de la urbanización del proyecto se calculó en \$4 millones, los que el museo espera financiar a través de subsidios y fondos relacionados, servicios con descuento y a pro-bono y apoyo de los defensores del Museo. Yollocalli Arts Reach es una iniciativa ganadora del Museo Nacional de Arte Mexicano (NMMA). De acuerdo a NMMA, el piso principal del edificio incluirá un área de recepciones, oficinas



del personal, áreas de almuerzo, una galería y una cabina de grabación. Los estudiantes de Yollocalli utilizarán el primer piso, que estará también abierto a los miembros de la comunidad para reuniones, talleres, actuaciones y otras reuniones. El segundo piso incluirá cuatro estudios de arte, salas de descanso adicionales y espacios de

reunión. Desde su creación por NMMA en 1997, la iniciativa Yollocalli Arts Reach ha provisto igualdad de acceso a los recursos comunitarios, artísticos y culturales para los jóvenes. El trabajo para renovar y restaurar el edificio está en camino. El Museo espera abrir la nueva instalación a principio del 2025.

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Treasurer Maria Pappas Analysis Shows Record-High Property Tax Increases for South Suburban Homeowners

Homeowners in many south and southwest suburbs will have to pay a lot more in property taxes as the median tax bill jumped a record 19.9 percent in the region, according to an analysis released by Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas. The biggest increases in homeowners' tax bills occurred in 15

south suburbs where taxes soared 30 percent or more. Of those 15 suburbs, 13 have mostly Black populations. In two towns, Dixmoor and Phoenix, the median tax bill more than doubled. A research team created by Pappas released its Tax Year 2023 Bill Analysis, a detailed examination of nearly 1.8

million bills to be mailed to property owners July 2 and due a month later on Aug. 1. This year's Second Installment bills include a new feature, "Where Your Money Goes," that breaks down the amounts of money billed by each taxing district and shows whether taxes went up or down. Among key findings

of the analysis:
 •Across Cook County, property taxes rose about \$706 million, climbing from \$17.6 billion to \$18.3 billion. Homeowners are shouldering an extra \$611 million, or nearly 86 percent of this year's increase, while commercial properties owe an extra \$102.9 million and taxes



on vacant land dropped by \$7.8 million.

•In the south and southwest suburbs, where all properties were reassessed, taxes rose a total of \$265.4 million. The median south suburban residential tax bill increased by 19.9 percent, the largest percentage increase in at least 29 years, according to Treasurer's data. Homeowners bore the brunt of the increase as their taxes rose \$396.8 million while taxes on

commercial properties dropped by \$121.6 million. The analysis is the latest addition to the Pappas Studies, a series of examinations of the complex property tax system available at cookcountytreasurer.com. Property owners who don't want to wait for their bills to arrive in the mail can pay their taxes online now at cookcountytreasurer.com. Partial payments are accepted.

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Celebration for 'Boogie' Street Sign Marks 51 Years Since Death of Pilsen Anti-Violence Worker

Family and friends of the late David 'Boogie' Gonzalez gathered Saturday morning, June 22, to honor the Pilsen-based street violence intervention worker who was killed in a drive-by shooting during a mediation in Harrison Park on June 19, 1973. The group assembled at 9 a.m. at 18th and Wood streets, the northeast corner of Harrison Park, then marched half a mile east to unveil the new "Boogie Gonzalez" honorary street sign. The request to the city of Chicago for the sign was spearheaded by 25th Ward Alderman Byron Sigcho-Lopez. The memorial event was being organized by the Gonzalez Foundation, created in 2012 by Boogie's nieces, Vicky Gonzalez Guy and Tanya Gonzalez, to fund scholarships for art students in Pilsen. "Boogie

was a tireless youth worker at El Centro de la Causa," said Laura Paz, a Pilsen resident and supporter of the foundation. "He made it his mission to stop the street clubs on 18th Street from killing each other. He had united all the clubs to talk peace and work for the community. It was at this peace event in Harrison Park that he was shot and killed. He gave his life for all of us, to better our community and world."



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La Celebración del Letrero de 'Boogie' en la Calle Marca 51 Años de la Muerte del Trabajador Antiviolencia de Pilsen

Familia y amigos del fallecido David 'Boogie' González se reunieron el sábado por la mañana, el 22 de junio, para honrar al trabajador interventor de la violencia en la calle de Pilsen, quien falleció a tiros desde un vehículo durante una mediación en Harrison Park, el 19 de junio de 1973. El grupo se reunió a las 9 a.m. en las calles 18 y Wood, esquina noreste de Harrison Park, y marcharon media milla al este para revelar el nuevo letrero honorario en la calle, "Boogie González". La petición a la ciudad de Chicago para el letrero fue encabezada por el Concejal del Distrito 25, Byron Sigcho-López. El evento conmemorativo fue organizado por la Fundación González creada en el 2012 por las



sobrinas de Boogie, Vicky González Guy y Tanya González, para patrocinar becas para estudiantes de arte en Pilsen. "Boogie fue un incansable trabajador joven de El Centro de la Causa", dijo Laura Paz, residente de Pilsen y partidaria de la fundación. "Se propuso impedir que

los clubes callejeros de la calle 18 se mataran entre sí. Había unido a todos los clubes para hablar de paz y trabajar en la comunidad. Fue en este evento de paz en Harrison Park donde fue balaceado y muerto. Dio su vida por todos nosotros, para mejorar nuestra comunidad y el mundo".

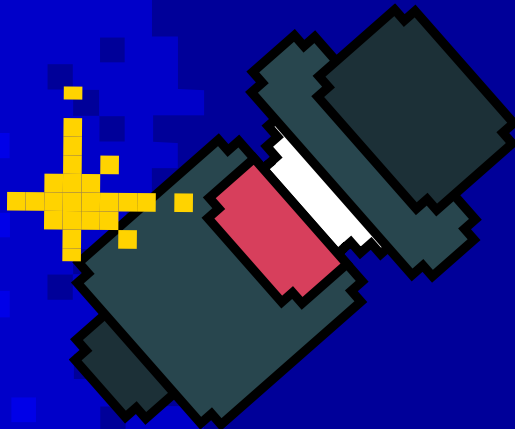

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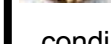
